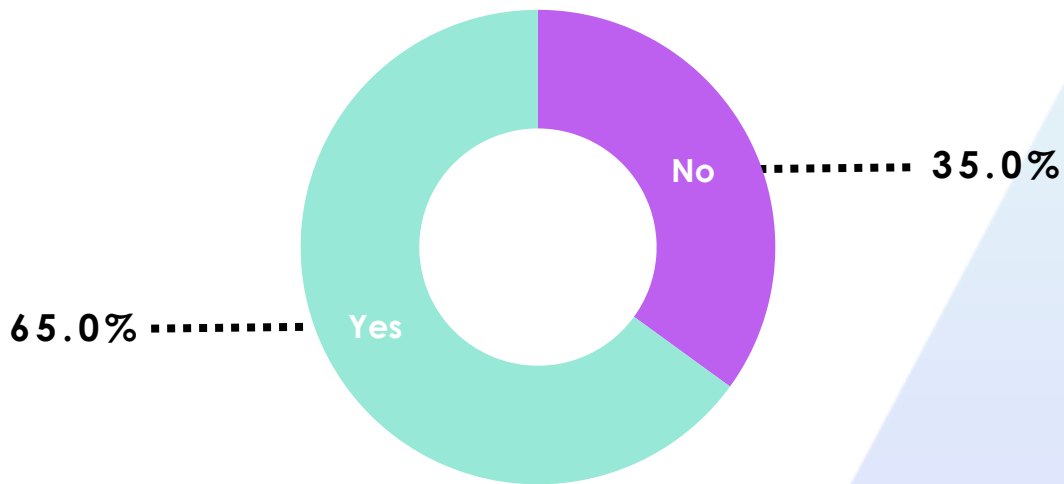

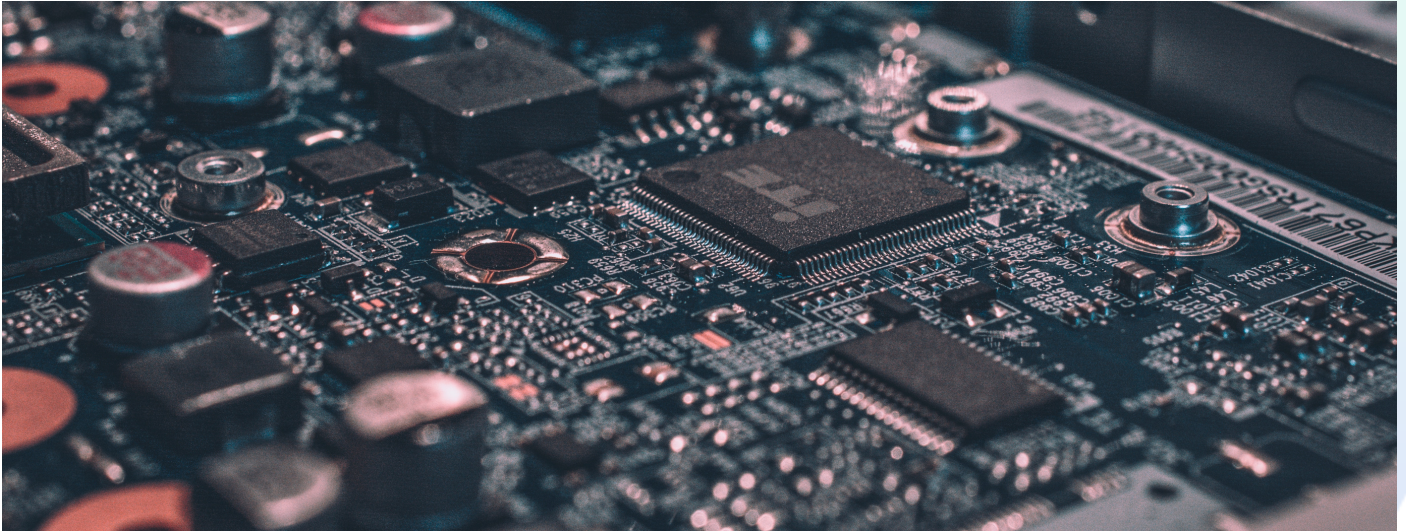
Is technology the answer to improving accessibility?

A CLOSER LOOK: BUILDING A BRIGHTER FUTURE



In October, a state-of-the-art residential building opened at the National Star College, Ullenwood. National Star College provides education and therapy for young people with complex physical and learning disabilities.

The residential building is a Smart House and includes voice-activated technology; there's even a voice-activated fridge! Also, students can use artificial intelligence (AI) to assist with their everyday needs.

The Building a Brighter Future building has 13 bedrooms, each installed with overhead tracking hoists to assist residents. The ambition is that students with complex physical and learning disabilities can live independently and explore what technology might work best for them.

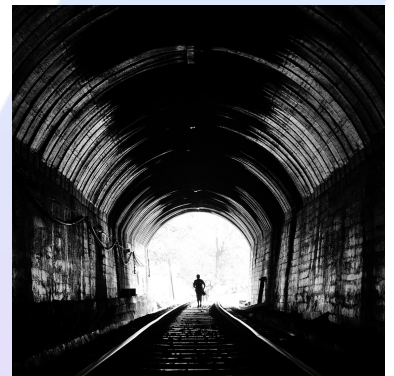
Elgin Marbles row deepens
